



A Historical Perspective...

### 1960'S - A Decade+ of Growth

 Between 1956 and 1972, the State of Florida established six public universities (USF, FAU, UCF, UWF, FIU, UNF) and 24 of the 28 current FCS institutions.



- Several universities were "upper-level only"; as such, the standard route to a baccalaureate degree went through a community college.
- · FL's higher ed. boom created a great need for seamless articulation.







#### 1975

- Statewide Course Numbering System (SCNS)
- Required all public sector institutions to participate in the SCNS.
- Today, there are more than 110,000 active postsecondary courses on the SCNS (Prep., PSAV, Undergraduate, Graduate, + EPI)

2+2 Agreement with Independent Colleges and Universities of Florida (ICUF); updated in 1997, 2006, 2013

- 112 institutions currently participate in 2+2 and SCNS
  - 11 Public Universities
  - 28 State + Community Colleges
  - 40 Career + Technical Centers
  - 33 Non-public Institutions







### 1971

- Statewide Articulation Agreement (2+2)
- · Defined the Associate of Arts (AA) as the transfer degree.
- Confirmed the general education transfer guarantee (est. 1959).
  - Guaranteed Admission to upper-division of State University System (except select admissions)
- Established a statewide common course numbering system - determined by Joint Faculty Discipline Committee



• Created the Articulation Coordinating Committee (ACC) to serve as a forum for discussing and coordinating ways to facilitate student transitions

### 1995 - Time to Degree (SB 2330)

- · Created Degree Length requirements.
- Limited General Education requirements to 36-hours (5 subject areas).
- · Mandated Common Prerequisites for baccalaureate degree programs.
- · Provided for Course Leveling (upper vs. lower).
- · Planning for single, computer-assisted student advising and degree audit system - FACTS.org.
- Common Calendar placed in State Board of Ed. Rule (10 Day. Window).
- Common College Transcripts.







### 2011- ACC Support (HB 7151)

- Legislation codified the Articulation Coordinating Committee in Florida Statutes.
- · ACC is responsible for making statewide articulation policy recommendations to HECC, SBE, and BOG.
- Education (with SUS Chancellor input) appoints ACC members.









## 1960'S - A Decade+ of Growth

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Facilitate Transferability

Reduce Costs (to Student/State) Student Focus on Programs (Not Courses)

Expand Access Define Course Equivalencies (Two Systems) Drive Completions (Credentials ASAP)

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
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 Legislature abolished sector boards and created single State Board of Education - responsible for oversight of K-20 education.

New SBOE -Oversight was Cabinet Board of Regents
State Board of Community Colleges
State Board of Independent Colleges + Universities
Florida Board of Non-public Career Education

- Also, Legislature authorized the FCS to offer baccalaureate degree programs for the first time.
- In 2014, 24 of 28 institutions offered more than 170 workforce baccalaureate degrees.



 One year after governance consolidation, a Constitutional amendment passed creating the Florida Board of Governors to oversee state universities.


State and Community Colleges
have remained under the oversight
of the State Board of Education.



 The State Board of Education and the Florida Board of Governors adopted parallel rules + regulations  This move of the two governing bodies reaffirmed a commitment to the 2+2 articulation system.

- Commissioner of Education (with SUS Chancellor input) appoints ACC members.



## The ACC...

### and what it's responsible for.

Monitor entrance/exit requirements between systems for seamless transfer; make recommendations for improvement.

Develop guidelines and facilitate statewide articulation agreements.

Promote and annually recommend acceleration mechanism (AP, IB, AICE, CLEP, Dual Enrollment, etc.) equivalencies for SBE/BOG approval.

Annually review statewide articulation agreement, SCNS, course levels, application of transfer credit requirements and instances of transfer/admission difficulty.

Publish annual list of common General Education courses and degree program prerequisites.

Examine statewide data to make K-20 articulation improvements.

Make recommendations to improve interface with statewide computer-based student advising system.



## 2±2Guarantee

Every Associate in Arts graduate from a Florida College System institution:

Shall have met all general education requirements

Shall have fulfilled the "Gordon Rule" requirements Must be granted admission to the upper-division of a state university (with exception of limited access, teacher certification, or major programs requiring audition)

Shall be awarded 60 hours by the state university

Shall receive priority for admission to a state university over out-ofstate transfers

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
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

### Florida 2<sup>nd</sup> Nationally in Associate Degree Awards




### SUS Enrollment

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


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# SUS Enrollment




AA Transfer applicants to SUS increased by 12.8%


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
## SUS Analysis of FCS Transfers

# Preserving 2+2 Today + Beyond...

- Periodically review the Statewide Articulation Agreement word-by-word (last in 2011) to make policy recommendations to HECC, SBE, BOG, and the FL Legislature.
- Continue monitoring General Education statutory changes (2012 HB 7135 (Gen. Ed. to 30 hours); 2013 SB 1720 (Gen. Ed. back to 36 hours)) to protect integrity of in-state articulation.
- Evaluate additional means for A.S. completers to successfully transfer through 2+2 with SUS institutions; currently 11 A.S. degrees transfer to B.S.
- Question expansion of SUS programs seeking specific prerequisites outside the scope of common prerequisites.


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





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
