Dr. Bill Law asked for approval for the following resolution:

From its earliest days, The Florida College System has provided a means for Floridians to have affordable access to a college education. We have done this within a strong commitment to equality – we take great pride in our efforts to enroll, support and graduate a diverse student population that mirrors the communities in which we live.

At present, we are proudly serving the needs of those students who were not born in the United States but who have lived in Florida, graduated from a Florida high school and seek to join the ranks of productive citizens by obtaining a postsecondary credential. These students – collectively referred to as "DACA students" – are permitted to enroll in the Florida College System and to attend courses paying the same as other Florida high school graduates. We supported and assisted in getting this beneficial legislation passed.

The uncertainty in America regarding the continued supportive status of DACA students is creating a stressful and debilitative environment for learning and success. The Council of Presidents of the Florida College System urges both the Florida Legislature and the Federal Government to maintain current permissions and legal protections for these students to enroll, attend and complete their college education.

Action: Upon a motion by Dr. Bill Law and a Mr. David Armstrong, the resolution as presented was approved without objection.

1.0 Approval, Policy & Advocacy Meeting Minutes, February 10, 2017

2.0 Update, 2017 Legislative Priorities

Dr. Ed Meadows reported the Senate released their budget. The Senate's budget reduces higher education overall by approximately \$131 million. The Florida College System is facing a reduction by \$55 million to developmental education, \$30 million in suspension of state incentive for performance funding, and \$10 million in CAPE performance funds. In all, the FCS bears almost 75% of all higher education cuts in the Senate proposals.

Ms. Sandy Cesaretti Ray reported six colleges are impacted by the Senate's budget reduction to workforce programs.

Mr. Chris Hansen reported Senator Negron has asked for input on SB 374. A two-page opinion with proposed changes has been submitted to Senator Negron.

Mr. Michael Brawer reported several gun related bills have been heard. SB 128, known as the "Stand Your Ground" bill, will shift a key burden of proof in "stand your ground", self-defense cases from defendants to prosecutors in the pre-trial hearings. The bill passed the Senate. The House version of the bill awaits its stop in the House Judiciary Committee. SB 622 does not look like it will move forward.

Dr. Ed Meadows adjourned the Policy and Advocacy meeting at 8:53 a.m. without objection.
