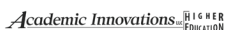

TCC FIT was developed in late 2016 to meet a need for wellness services available to college employees at no cost. TCC possessed a small employee gym that was rarely used, had limited equipment, and was in poor condition. To start, a small amount of end-year funds were allocated to the employee gym to purchase a few larger key items that were multipurpose, such as an elliptical and an all-in-one gym system, and enhancing fitness options with a variety of smaller purchases, such as mats, stretch bands, hand weights, and so forth. Once the equipment was in place and the gym cleaned, it was time to find a way to attract employees back to the gym and provide guided instruction for fitness activities.
