Dr. John Holdnak served as the sixth President of Gulf Coast State College for eight years before his retirement in June of this year. During his presidency, Dr. Holdnak was responsible for providing leadership for academic programs and student support services. He led the charge for community efforts in economic development activities working alongside with Bay County Economic Development Authority and assisting with bringing new business opportunities and companies to Bay County. Under his presidency, the GCSC Foundation grew from \$31 million to over \$38 million, secured final funding from the legislature for the STEM Center, and was awarded funding from multiple Triumph grants to assist the College in critical areas such as Nursing, UVS, and Emergency Response. Under President Holdnak's leadership, the College also upgraded internal roadways and parking lots, relocated the softball complex, added to the Veterans and Military Resource Center, and created a healthcare clinic on campus with PanCare of Florida, Inc.

Dr. Holdnak was instrumental in guiding the College through the recovery of Hurricane Michael, a category 5 hurricane. More than 58 million dollars in damages were sustained at the College campuses. In 2018 when the hurricane hit, Gulf Coast State College had accomplished an all-time 10 percent gain in enrollment. The college opened in 28 days after the storm to prevent veterans from losing their federal benefits. President Holdnak was the driving force behind an exceptional team of Gulf Coast employees whom he rallied together, bringing in resources to assist employees and students. If the hurricane were not enough, he also skillfully guided the college through a multi-year pandemic.

Before becoming president of Gulf Coast, Dr. Holdnak served in many capacities and a variety of positions at the College, playing a pivotal role in the progress and accomplishments of the institution. In 2008 he left Gulf Coast for six years to serve as the Vice Chancellor for Financial Policy and Executive Vice Chancellor of the Florida College System. It was in these roles that he provided statewide leadership and exercised administrative and supervisory responsibility for finance, budgeting, information systems, operations, retirement, personnel administration, and facilities planning for the State of Florida's College System.

A native of Pensacola and a graduate of Pensacola Junior College, Florida State University, and the University of West Florida, John Holdnak is a Lifetime AFC member and is involved with a host of vital community activities and organizations. Dr. Holdnak resides in Panama City with his wife, Terrie, and they are the parents of two grown children and a grandchild.

The criteria to be considered for this award include:

1. Demonstration of an exceptional commitment to one of Florida's colleges and/or the Florida College System.
2. Be a student, faculty member, administrator, trustee, or alumni of one of Florida's colleges or be a supporter of a college and/or champion for the Florida College System, or be a state legislator or member of the executive branch of the state government.

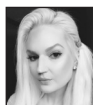
