# EASTERN FLORIDA STATE COLLEGE CHAPTER OF THE

### ASSOCIATION OF FLORIDA COLLEGES

### ARTICLE I: NAME

The name of this organization shall be Eastern Florida State College (EFSC) Chapter of the Association of Florida Colleges (AFC), a not-for-profit organization.

### ARTICLE II: PURPOSE

The purpose of this Chapter shall be to promote the development and advancement of EFSC. To this end the Chapter shall endeavor:

- 1. To serve as a comprehensive professional organization for anyone employed (full-time or part-time) by, or associated with, or retired from EFSC;
- 2. To democratically represent the interests of all members, and to provide leadership in seeking solutions to matters of EFSC concern;
- 3. To work for a continuing cooperative spirit among College trustees, administrators, faculty members, professional and career employees, and all College employees past and present;
- 4. To provide forums for the purpose of discussing and improving such matters in ESFC educational programs, curriculum development, innovative administrative and instructional procedures, and the general professional environment;
- 5. To play an active role in promoting legislation beneficial to EFSC and to disseminate information regarding pertinent legislation;
- 6. To facilitate communication and cooperation among all levels within EFSC; and
- 7. To promote public understanding and support of EFSC and the Florida College System.

The EFSC Chapter of AFC supports the following statement from the AFC State Bylaws:

"The divergent groups represented by AFC and the legal and professional obligations of these groups mandate that the Association (the state-wide organization, and its board, committees, commissions, regions, local chapters, or other officially designated constituent groups) cannot and will not participate in the name of the Association in collective negotiations as a representative of either management or labor. The Association shall not become involved in any collective bargaining process which would impact directly or indirectly any Florida College System institution or prospective, current and/or former employee. The Association shall not advocate or oppose participation by any group of College employees in collective negotiations with their employer."

### ARTICLE III: MEMBERSHIP AND DUES

Nine classes of membership are established within the Chapter: Regular, Contributing, Institutional, Affiliate, Associate, Retiree, Life, Adjunct Faculty/Part-time Employee and Honorary Life. Only Regular, Contributing, Retiree, Life, and Honorary Life members have full rights of membership which include voting and holding office. No member shall concurrently occupy more than one voting position within the general membership, or the Board of Directors, or Committee, or Commission or other sub-element of the Chapter. Membership in the AFC is open to

all individuals who fall within the nine classes of membership without regard to race, color, religion, gender, sexual orientation, age, disability, or national origin.

### SECTION 1 Membership Classes

- 1. Regular membership is open to any full-time EFSC employee
- 2. Contributing membership is automatic for any member of EFSC Board of Trustees.
- 3. <u>Institutional membership is open to any Florida College System institution.</u>
- 4. <u>Affiliate</u> membership is open to institutions and organizations, including student groups, whose activities are recognized by the AFC Board of Directors as being closely related to the functions and purposes of the Florida College System. Regular and Associate membership is not a prerequisite for members of affiliated organizations.
- 5. <u>Associate</u> membership is open to individuals whose professional or educational activities are closely related to the functions and purposes of EFSC and to any other individuals who, in the opinion of the AFC Board of Directors, exhibit interest in supporting the aims and activities of the Association.
- 6. Retiree membership is open to any person who has retired from EFSC.
- 7. <u>Life membership is available to Regular and Retiree members.</u>
- 8. <u>Adjunct Faculty/Part-time Employee</u> membership is open to any person who is employed less than full-time in an instructional, administrative, or support position at EFSC.
- 9. <u>Honorary Life</u> membership is conferred on persons who, in the opinion of the AFC Board of Directors, have made an outstanding contribution to the College and/or the Association. Recipients of Honorary Life memberships are recommended through the AFC Awards Committee.

### SECTION 2 Membership Dues

- 1. Regular Dues: Dues for Regular and Associate memberships are \$35 per year for individuals earning less than \$30,000 annually, \$45 per year for individuals earning \$30,000 to \$75,000 annually, \$55 per year for individuals earning between \$75,000 and \$100,000 for state dues, and \$70 per year for individuals earning in excess of \$100,000The EFSC Chapter will be reimbursed \$1.50 for each member paying \$70 or less.. The membership is on an annualized basis from time of enrollment.
- 2. Associate Dues: Associate dues shall be \$100.
- 3. Institutional Dues: Institutional dues shall be established by the State AFC Board of Directors.
- 4. Affiliate Membership Dues Affiliate membership dues shall be established by the State AFC Board of Directors. Contact the State AFC office for current Affiliate Membership dues.
- 5. Contributing Member Dues: In recognition of their service to Florida's public colleges, there shall be no dues charged persons who are contributing members. Contributing members shall have the same rights and privileges as Regular members.
- 6. Retiree Membership Dues: Annual dues for retired members are \$10 per year.
- 7. Life Membership Dues: Dues for full-time Regular members desiring Life membership shall be equivalent to ten (10) times the current Regular annual dues remitted to the Association prior to June 30 during any membership year. Dues for Retiree members desiring Life membership shall be equivalent to five (5) times the current Retiree annual dues remitted to the Association prior to June 30 during any membership year.
- 8. Adjunct Faculty/Part-time Membership Dues: Annual dues for Adjunct Faculty and Part-time employees shall be \$10 per year.
- 9. Honorary Life Membership Dues: Honorary life members are exempt from paying dues.

SECTION 3 Membership Year

The membership year for all institutional members and all other membership classes shall begin July 1 of each year and end June 30 of the following year.

### ARTICLE IV: OFFICERS

### SECTION 1 Officers

The officers of the EFSC Chapter shall be current members of the Chapter and shall be classified as elected or appointed.

### SECTION 2 Elected Officers

The elected officers shall be the President, President-Elect, Past President, Four (4) Campus Vice-Presidents, Secretary, and Treasurer.

### SECTION 3 Appointed Officers

Appointed Officers shall be:

- 1. Legislative Representative
- 2. Membership Chair
- 3. Historian
- 4. Publications/Social Media Representative
- 5. Four (4) Campus Activity Coordinators

### SECTION 4 Selection of Officers

The President-Elect, Secretary, and Treasurer shall be elected by a simple majority of votes cast by the membership at large. A plurality of members voting shall be sufficient for elections. Each campus will elect a Campus Vice-President. Campus election shall be by a simple majority of those campus members who vote. Appointed officers are nominated by the President and confirmed by the Board of Directors by a simple majority vote.

### SECTION 5 Term of Office

All elected and appointed officers shall serve for a period of one year, beginning January 1 after the Annual Conference. The President shall serve for a period of one year beginning January 1 after the Annual Conference. The President-Elect will assume the office of President at the end of the one-year term as President-Elect. Appointed officers will serve from the time of appointment until the following December 31.

### SECTION 6 Elections

- 1. Elections of officers shall be prior to the AFC Annual Conference.
- 2. A Nominating Committee (appointed by the Board of Directors) shall present a panel of candidates for elective officers. The names of said nominees shall be distributed to the membership at least two weeks prior to the election. Write-in candidates will be accepted.

### SECTION 7 Vacancies

If the office of the President becomes vacant, the President-Elect will become President for the remainder of the unexpired term. If the office of the President-Elect becomes vacant, a special election will be held to allow the College membership to fill this vacancy. Other vacancies will be filled by appointment by the President with confirmation by a simple majority of the Board of Directors.

### SECTION 8 Duties of Officers

- 1. The President shall:
  - Preside at meetings of the general Chapter membership and Board of Directors,
  - Represent the Chapter in all matters,
  - Authorize the expenditure and payment of EFSC Chapter funds which have not been accounted for in the approved budget of the Chapter,
  - Prepare a projected annual budget by May 30 to present to the Board before July 1 of each year

- Work with the Nominating Committee to identify candidates for non-voting Chapter officer positions by September 30
- Submit recommendations for non-voting Chapter officer positions to the Board of Director for voting by October 30
- Appoint standing and ad hoc committees, with the approval of the Board of Directors.

### 2. The President-Elect shall:

- Perform the duties of the President during the President's absence or disability,
- Perform other duties assigned by the President.

### 3. The Campus Vice-Presidents shall:

- Be the Association leaders on their campuses,
- Promote AFC memberships and recruiting efforts,
- Recommend campus activity directors to coordinate all activities on their campuses for approval by President and Board,
- Oversees collection of fundraising funds and reporting/delivery to treasurer,
- Perform other duties as assigned by the President.

### 4. The Secretary shall:

- Record the minutes of general Chapter meetings and the Board of Directors,
- Perform other duties as assigned by the Chapter President.

### 5. The Treasurer shall:

- Collect and forward dues, as directed, to the office of the AFC state office
- Reconcile Chapter check book financial accounts
- Works with campus vice-president to collect and deposit fundraising funds
- Keep accurate records of monies collected and dispersed
- Safeguard and disburse any other Chapter funds as authorized by the bylaws
- Prepare monthly/quarterly financial reports to present to the Board
- Chair the Audit Committee

### 6. The Legislative Representative shall:

- Provide a communication link between the AFC Legislative Committee and the Chapter membership on all matters pertaining to legislation affecting the College,
- Develop an ongoing relationship with legislative representatives in Brevard county,
- Disseminate all pertinent legislative information to the membership, serve as the official Chapter spokesperson for the Chapter's legislative delegation, and coordinate any Chapter activities concerned with informing the delegation about legislation affecting the College.
- Present legislative information during general Chapter membership meeting

### 7. The Membership Chair shall:

- Chair membership committee
- Be responsible for organizing and coordinating the annual AFC-Chapter membership campaign
- Maintain Chapter membership roster and provide copies to the campus AFC Board members.
- Distribute AFC publications to Chapter members.

### 8. The Immediate Past President shall:

• Compile, coordinate, edit and produce the Chapter Year Book, and submit to the

Region III Director by or on the submission date as stated in the AFC Leadership Handbook.

- Perform the duties of Financial Manager or delegate responsibility.
- Works with President to prepare projected annual budget

### ARTICLE V: BOARD OF DIRECTORS

**SECTION 1 Voting Members** 

The voting members of the ESFC Chapter Board of Directors shall be the: President, President-Elect, Campus Vice-Presidents, Secretary, Treasurer, and the Immediate Past President. All appointed officers will be non-voting members of the Board.

SECTION 2 Duties of Board of Directors

The duties of the Board of Directors shall be:

- 1. to approve an annual operating budget for the Chapter, as well as any subsequent budgetary amendments which it deems necessary;
- 2. review recommendations of any Chapter committee or Commission representatives;
- 3. serve as the Chapter membership committee;
- 4. carry out such activities and implement and act on such resolutions as adopted by the local Chapter or the State Assembly of Delegates; and
- 5. act on such other matters as may be germane to the operation of the Chapter.

Any member of the Board of Directors may be recalled through due process provided three-fourths of the Board of Directors shall concur.

SECTION 3 Duties of the College President

The College President shall be a non-voting, ex-officio member of the Board of Directors.

### ARTICLE VI: COMMITTEES

SECTION 1 Standing Committees

The following Standing Committees may be established. The method of appointment, composition and duties are detailed in Standing Rule IV.

- 1. Bylaws Committee
- 2. Audit Committee
- 3. Awards Committee

SECTION 2 Special Committees

Ad hoc committees may be appointed by the Chapter President as needed with approval by the Board of Directors.

### ARTICLE VII: MEETINGS OF THE CHAPTER

SECTION 1 General Chapter Meetings

General Chapter meetings shall take place once a term at alternating campuses each year. Chapter members shall be notified at least two weeks prior to all Chapter meetings. The Board of Directors shall set time and place of general Chapter meetings. The members attending the general Chapter meeting will be considered quorum.

SECTION 2 Board of Directors Meetings

Board of Directors Meetings shall take place on an as-needed basis, as called and coordinated by the President. A quorum shall consist of five voting board members.

SECTION 3 Special Meetings

The President shall convene a special meeting whenever in receipt of a petition signed by five or more members requesting a special meeting. A petition or resolution requesting a special meeting will indicate

the topic for disposition or the reason for the special meeting and will also indicate the date and place. The President will be bound thereby.

### ARTICLE VIII: DELEGATES

Current Chapter Officers and Commission Representatives will serve as delegates to the AFC Assembly of Delegates for the Annual Conference. Other delegates to the Annual Conference will be allocated in a manner as to give each campus representation.

### ARTICLE IX: COMMISSIONS

The local Chapter will designate voting representatives to each commission in the fall, prior to the Annual Conference. These representatives will serve for a term of one year. Voting representatives to each commission must be current members of AFC. Commission representatives may also serve as Delegates. Officers of the Chapter are eligible to be commission representatives with approval from immediate supervision. Commission representatives shall officially represent the ESFC Chapter when voting on Commission business, and during the period between Annual Conference shall act in liaison capacity with the Chapter and the State Commission Chairperson.

### ARTICLE X: BYLAWS AMENDMENT AND ADOPTION

These Bylaws may be amended by the affirmative vote of two-thirds of the membership voting provided that no vote will be taken on the proposal to amend unless notice to the general membership is given at least fifty (50) days in advance. A written waiver of such notice, signed by the person entitled to notice, shall be equivalent to the giving of such notice.

The amended Bylaws shall be adopted upon concurrence of two-thirds of the membership voting.

### ARTICLE XI: PARLIAMENTARY AUTHORITY

Rules contained in the current edition of Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised, shall govern the Chapter in all cases to which they are applicable and in which they are not inconsistent with these Bylaws and any special rules of order the Chapter may adopt.

### STANDING RULES OF THE ESFC CHAPTER OF AFC

### RULE I: OFFICERS

### SECTION A Duties of Officers

- 1. President. In addition to those duties enumerated in the Bylaws, the President shall represent the Chapter in matters pertaining to the Chapter; call meetings of the Board of Directors; and appoint the members of such committees as authorized by the Bylaws. With the approval of the Board of Directors, the President shall designate such additional functionaries and perform such other tasks as are deemed essential to the welfare of the Chapter.
- 2. President-Elect. In addition to those duties enumerated in the Bylaws, the President-Elect shall serve as coordinator of the commission's activities; and perform such other duties as the President may direct.
- 3. Vice-President. The Vice-President shall serve as coordinator of campus activities. In addition, this officer shall perform those duties assigned by the President.
- 4. Secretary. The Secretary will be responsible for recording the minutes of all Board of Director's meetings and general membership meetings. This officer will also be responsible for all general correspondence between the Chapter and AFC state office as directed by the President of the Chapter.
- 5. Treasurer. The Treasurer will be responsible for all financial record keeping and reporting. This officer must have pertinent records updated and readily available to the Board of Directors. Also, The Treasurer will select an auditing team committee and oversee the audit of the Chapter's financial records at least thirty (30) days before the end of the fiscal year.

### SECTION B Vacancies of Office

Except as otherwise provided in the Bylaws or these Standing Rules, the Board of Directors shall appoint a replacement to serve the balance of the current term.

### RULE II: BOARD OF DIRECTORS

In addition to those duties specified in the Bylaws, the Board of Directors shall review recommendations of any Chapter committee; carry out activities and implement and act on such resolutions as adopted by the Chapter's general membership; and act on such other matters as may be germane to the operation of the Chapter. The Board of Directors, represented by the President, shall refer major policy matters to the Chapter's general membership for its action. The Board may recommend action on matters referring to the general membership.

### RULE III: APPOINTED OFFICERS

The President will recommend at least one person, for Board approval, to fill each of the following positions:

### 1. Membership Chair

The Membership Chair shall be responsible for organizing and coordinating the annual membership campaign and for providing to the AFC Executive Director a current list of all AFC members.

### 2. Legislative Representative

The Legislative Representative shall provide a communication link between the AFC Legislative Committee and the Chapter membership on all matters pertaining to legislation affecting the College. The legislative representative shall disseminate all pertinent legislative information to the membership, serve as the official Chapter spokesperson to the College's legislative delegation, and coordinate any Chapter activities concerned with informing the delegation about legislation affecting the College.

### 3. Historian

The Historian oversee a repository of all Chapter activities and be responsible for documenting all Chapter events for inclusion in and publication of the annual Chapter Book.

### 4. Publications/Social Media Representative

The Publications/Social Media Representative shall submit articles, press releases, and/or photos of Chapter events and activities to appropriate media, maintain the Chapter on-line website and its links to the College and AFC websites, add or remove articles, photos and information as directed by the Board or the President.

### RULE IV: COMMITTEES

### SECTION A Standing Committees

### 1. Bylaws Committee

This Committee shall review the Chapter Bylaws and Standing Rules to ascertain them to be in accordance with current Chapter needs, and, if necessary, make recommendations to the Board of Directors regarding changes in the Bylaws and Standing Rules.

This Committee shall review all resolutions submitted in accordance with Rule V, and recommend appropriate action to the Board of Directors.

### 4. Audit Committee

The Treasurer will select members to form the Auditing Committee and oversee the audit of the Chapter's financial records at least thirty (30) days before the end of the fiscal year.

### 5. Award Committee

This Committee shall review the criteria for each of the awards identified by the Board of Directors and from a slate of nominations for each category recommend one member for each award to the Board of Directors.

### RULE V: RESOLUTIONS

Proposed resolutions of intent or of substance will be submitted to the Board of Directors by the Bylaws Committee no later than fifty (50 days) prior to a planned general membership meeting. A written waiver of such notice, signed by the person entitled to notice, shall be equivalent to the giving of such notice.

Such proposed resolutions will be presented to the general Chapter membership.

RULE VI: AMENDMENT AND SUSPENSION

SECTION A. Amendment

These Standing Rules may be amended at any regular or called meeting of the general membership by vote of two-thirds of those members present.

SECTION B. Suspension

These Standing Rules may be suspended at any regular or called meeting of the general membership by a vote of two-thirds of those members present.

# AFC @ EFSC Strategic Plan 2019-20

The purpose of this plan is to organize our thoughts and put into writing some of the ideas and initiatives that we as a chapter would like to explore for 2019-20. Many of these ideas carry forward from previous years and are areas that we should be constantly focused. This is not binding or all inclusive, merely an outline of ideas and potential actions and efforts.

Membership – in an effort to increase membership, the chapter will attempt the following:

- 1. Reach out to adjunct faculty and full-time faculty with fliers and increased awareness.
- 2. Research ideas to get retirees more involved.
- 3. Have key AFC members available at social, professional development, and fund-raising activities to provide information and answer questions about AFC.
- 4. Assign a membership committee to generate ideas and ways to promote AFC and increase membership.

Professional Development – AFC @ EFSC wants to help develop our faculty and staff:

- 1. Continue to provide AFC updates from conferences.
- 2. Expand marketing and information about AFC opportunities, i.e. CCP program, Region III conference, Student Development Conference.
- 3. Continue to provide Professional Development Series events.
- 4. Be active in Region III events and opportunities.
- 5. Attempt to gain more interest in the CCP program for AFC @ EFSC members.

### State, Region, and Commission Participation

- 1. Encourage members to look for opportunities for leadership positions at the Region and State levels.
- 2. Send new chapter leaders to Legislative and Leadership conference.
- 3. Continue to encourage attendance at the region and annual conferences.

### By-Laws Review, Update, and Publish

- 1. Keep By-Laws up to date.
- 2. Annual review Updated in 2018.
- 3. Complete an annual review of the By-Laws.

### Chapter Book Committee

- 1. Ensure we have a designated committee for Chapter Book Development.
- 2. Understand Chapter Book deadlines and items for inclusion.

Awards – We need to ensure we are recognizing the appropriate people for jobs well done. This includes, but is not limited to:

- 1. Local campus awards for service.
- 2. Distinguished Service awards at AFC level.
- 3. Unsung hero awards Kathy Bauernfeind for 2019.

Legislative Issues – As a chapter, we have a responsibility to communicate the pertinent legislative issues to our chapter membership. Some initiatives might include:
