TRIO Connections of Central Program - to assist high school students within Seminole, Orange and Volusia counties persist in high school, graduate and enroll into a postsecondary institution or program.

Students more opportunities to explore educational and career-based options; financial literacy and knowledge of financial aid and how to apply and students have been able to receive exposure to college campuses by attending programs and college tours throughout the state of Florida. Additionally, outreach has been developed to reach persons who completed high school but either stopped out or never enrolled in a postsecondary institution or program to encourage and assist them in enrolling in a postsecondary institution or program.
- 7. How many and what type of people were served by this program? Over 1,000 high school students and high school completers have been served since the beginning of the program.
- List the objectives of the program. Objectives of the project is for students to graduate high school, complete a FASFA application, and to apply and enroll into a postsecondary program or institution.
- How have the objectives been met? Through financial aid presentations, FASFA labs, career immersion programs, college tours, summer jump-start programs and one-on-one parent/student follow-up meetings.

The advising "course" named the Student Advising Resource Center is a student's personalized connection to their assigned advisor through the college's Learning Management System, Canvas. Housed within this course is academic information related to student's success. The information contained within this course is housed in one central location so it's easily accessible to students. The content is divided by credit ranges so students can find information for commonly asked questions in their credit brackets. Within the resource center there is page with the assigned advisor contact information where they can communicate with their advisor using multiple modalities including email, phone, text and Canvas. Advisors also utilize the Student Advising Resource Center to communicate with their assigned case load of students where they have the ability to send targeted messages based on program plan, number of credits, special student groups and meta major. This communication approach is accurate and efficient due to the high Student to assigned advisor ratio. This also allows advisors to be more intentional while building a one on one connection with their assigned students.

6. What need did this program meet that was not being met?

The program met the need of meeting students where they are and utilizing the current mode of instructor communication. Most instructors utilize Canvas or a Canvas component within their classes. Since the implementation of Canvas for advising, communications from Student to Advisor have increased. Prior to the implementation of Canvas, the email response rate was low; however, we have seen tremendous growth with student communications as well as increase of appointments due to expanding our channels of communication with students. From 2017 to September 2019 there were 3,613 initiated Canvas messages sent from Advisors and 7,566 messages sent from students to advisors. Most advisor-initiated communications were mass messages indicating a larger student reach.

7. How many and what type of people were served by this program?

Currently there are 26,396 degree seeking students being served. This includes all degree seeking students in A.A., A.S., certificate and vocational programs.

8. List the objectives of the program.

Yes, the objectives of the program have been met by centralizing information and increased student/advisor communications.

10. What was the cost of providing this program?

There was no cost to provide this program. The department utilized dedicated internal college resources in order for this initiative to come to fruition.

11. What was the funding source?

Dedicated internal resources.

12. How did you justify the cost of this program? (Was it cost effective? Did you save money? Other financial benefits?)

There was no allocated budget for this initiative as we used the dedicated internal resources.

13. What was the institutional involvement, especially outside of Student Services, in establishing the program? What is the continued involvement?

The Department of Academic Advising and Counseling collaborated with E-Learning, eServices and Computer Technology Services. This platform is a work in progress as enhancements are made and continuous collaboration between all departments is ongoing.

14. What are the results or findings from the evaluations?

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After soliciting student and staff feedback the results were positive. In regards to the communication feature within the resource center many students preferred communicating with their assigned advisor through Canvas because it is the same method of communication that instructors utilize for their courses. There was a noticeable increase in advisor appointments after messages were sent.

15. Has the program been changed, revised, or improved as a result of the evaluations?

Yes, the Student Advising Resource Center is continuously being reviewed and updated to ensure information is accurate, consistent with policies, procedures, processes, and college resources.

Advisor Feedback

- An observation I have made is that the response time has been much quicker than what I have seen in the past. So, it appears the students are getting notifications through canvas and are actually reviewing the messages. For example, I sent a "Registration Announcement" yesterday informing students Spring 2018 registration is now open and I immediately received appointment requests. Usually, it takes a couple of days before I receive appointment requests after I send mass e-mails and texts.
- Canvas appears to be more effective of getting students to set up appointments with me. I got all of my next day appointments booked within an hour of sending a Canvas message.
- I've had one student send an email through Canvas, to review her degree audit and ed plan, so we've scheduled a phone conference for next week. In terms of feedback with this one conversation, I can say the process was smooth and easy to converse back and forth.
- The use of "Announcements" instead of "Inbox messages" seems to be a more efficient method for communication that gets sent to "all students".

April 2020 turned Sexual Assault Awareness Month into a virtual observance, rather than the interactive program usually offered by the Faculty Gender Violence Awareness Committee, Student Development including Student Life's clubs and organizations, Equity and Diversity/Title IX, and the Association of Florida Colleges - Seminole State Chapter. In our new reality, the same level of care and concern exists: Seminole State prohibits sexual misconduct in all its forms and holds students, employees, and visitors to certain standards of behavior in that area.


On April 23, the College partnered with Victim Service Center of Central Florida for an online panel discussion, "Sexual Assault in the LGBT+ Community: Prevention and Awareness." Several classes had members signed in, as well as employees and community members. As always, the messages applied to all survivors of sexual assault: vulnerability in areas such as homelessness, food insecurity, or family separation can increase vulnerability to sexual assault. Community resources exist, starting with the College's Academic Advising and Counseling Center.

On Denim Day, April 29, colleagues wearing jeans and other denim clothing joined in the international #DenimDay observance by posting pictures online. The day marks the international protest of an Italian Supreme Court decision. It ruled that a woman who was wearing jeans was not sexually assaulted, because jeans are so tight, her assailant could not have removed them without her consent.

Messaging to students this month included the definitions of sexual assault, date or acquaintance sexual assault, stalking, and sexual harassment. Each is prohibited by the College and there are consequences listed in the Student Code of Conduct as well as employee disciplinary standards. 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
SEMINOLE STATE COLLEGE AFC CHAPTER

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15 CHAPTER ORGANIZATION

BYLAWS SEMINOLE STATE COLLEGE OF FLORIDA CHAPTER of the ASSOCIATION OF FLORIDA COLLEGES

Article I – Name

The name of this organization shall be known as the Seminole State College of Florida Chapter of the Association of Florida Colleges.

Article II - Mission and Goals

The purpose of this Chapter shall be to: (1) present the opinion of the Association of Florida Colleges (AFC) members on important legislative matters to College administrators, state college leaders, community leaders and local and state legislators, (2) facilitate professional development opportunities for AFC Chapter members, (3) develop networking opportunities with College administrators, state colleges in Florida.

Article III - Membership

Membership in this Chapter is open to both full-time and part-time employees of Seminole State College of Florida upon payment of the annual dues. Members of the Seminole State College of Florida Board of Trustees are automatically members and are not required to pay dues. Membership is also open to retirees, life, and honorary life members upon payment of annual dues as outlined in the state AFC bylaws.

Article IV - Officers

Section 1. The officers of the Chapter shall make up the Executive Board of the Seminole State College of Florida Chapter and shall consist of: President, President-Elect, Immediate Past President, Legislative Representative, Publications Representative, Secretary, Treasurer, Membership Chair, Webmaster, Altamonte Springs Campus Representative, Center for Economic Development at Heathrow Representative, The Lee Campus at Oviedo Representative, and Sanford/Lake Mary Campus Representative.

Section 2. The offices may be filled by any AFC member of Seminole State College of Florida's Chapter. Section 3. The officers shall serve for one year beginning on June 1 following the year's elections.

Section 4. If the Office of the President becomes vacant, the President-Elect will become President for the remainder of the unexpired term. Other vacancies will be filled by appointment of the President.

Section 5. An officer may be removed from office at the discretion of the Board for non-performance of office duties. This action requires an affirmative vote by two-thirds of remaining Board members.

Section 6. The President shall preside at meetings, represent the Chapter, authorize expenditures of Seminole State College of Florida's Chapter funds with the knowledge and approval of the Treasurer or President-Elect upon the unavailability of the Treasurer, appoint standing and ad hoc committee members, and act as liaison between the AFC Board of Directors and the Chapter members.

Section 7. The President-Elect shall perform the duties of the President during his/her absence or disability, assume the office of President after serving his/her term as President-Elect, assist with all membership activities, perform duties as assigned by the President and may act as membership chair as appointed by the president.

Section 8. The Immediate Past President shall assist the President and President-Elect as an advisor.

Section 9. The Legislative Representative shall assume responsibility for all legislative activities within the Chapter.

Section 10. The Publications Representative shall be responsible for all publications within the Chapter. Duties will include but not be limited to maintaining an AFC annual book and providing information about AFC to the Seminole State College Marketing & Communications Department and publications@myafchome.org.

Section 11. The Treasurer shall collect and forward dues as directed to the Tallahassee office, safeguard and disburse Chapter funds as authorized by the President and state bylaws, maintain receipts and records for all financial transactions of the organization and ensure the deposit of funds to the AFC bank account. The Treasurer must co-authorize all disbursement of AFC Chapter funds. The Treasurer shall also assist the Membership Chair in maintaining a current Chapter membership roster.

Section 12. The Membership Chair shall maintain a current Chapter membership roster and coordinate Chapter membership drives.

Section 13. The Secretary shall record the minutes of the meetings of the Chapter and shall assist with handling incoming and outgoing correspondence.

Section 14. The Webmaster shall maintain the Chapter's AFC information pages on the Seminole State website and update the Seminole State AFC Chapter Facebook page.

Section 15. The Campus Representative shall be the liaison between the Seminole State College chapter Executive Board and

their campus constituents. The representative shall attend chapter meetings and events representing his or her respective campus.

Article V – Elections

Section 1. The elections committee will distribute a nominating ballot to AFC Chapter members prior to the April Chapter meeting, along with the instructions for completing and returning the nominating ballot.

Section 2. Using the names from the nominating ballots as a guide, the elections committee shall prepare an elections ballot with the names of eligible nominees and a write-in space for each position up for election. Names for each position shall be listed alphabetically on the ballot. No person's name shall be placed on the ballot that has not agreed to serve if elected.

Section 3. The elections committee shall tabulate votes and inform the incoming President and all candidates of the results. A candidate must receive a majority of votes to be elected.

Article VI – Meetings

Section 1. Meetings will be held bi-annually and called by the President, the President-Elect, or upon written request of five members of the Chapter.

Section 2. All AFC Chapter members shall be given written notice at least two working days prior to all Seminole State College of Florida's Chapter meetings.

Section 3. A quorum for Board Executive meetings shall be half the number of the elected officers plus one. A quorum for general meetings shall be nine members and one presiding AFC officer.

Article VII – Delegates to AFC

Section 1. Delegates to the AFC Assembly of Delegates shall consist of the College President or his/her designee, the thirteen Chapter Officers, and an additional number of delegates as determined by the AFC state bylaws and standing rules. Section 2. Delegates must be members of AFC and shall serve only until the next annual election of delegates.

Article VIII – Committees

Section 1. An elections committee shall be formed annually and headed by the outgoing President for the purpose of collecting nominations and administering elections for each Chapter office.

Section 2. A membership committee composed of at least three AFC members shall be appointed by the Chapter President and headed by the Membership Chair for the purpose of soliciting new and renewal memberships to the Seminole State College of Florida AFC Chapter.

Section 3. A bylaws committee composed of at least three AFC Board members shall be appointed annually by the Chapter President for the purpose of reviewing and proposing updates to the Chapter bylaws.

Section 4. Other committees shall be appointed by the President as he/she, or other members, deems necessary to carry out the work of the Chapter.

Article IX – Parliamentary Authority

The rules contained in the current edition of Robert's Rules of Order, Newly Revised shall govern the Chapter in all cases to which they are applicable and to which they are not inconsistent with these bylaws or the AFC bylaws or any special rules or orders that AFC or the Chapter may adopt.

Article X – Amendments

Section 1. These bylaws shall be reviewed annually by the bylaws committee that shall make recommendations to the Chapter's members.

Section 2. These bylaws may be amended by a two-thirds vote of members present or two-thirds of the Board of Directors and voting at any meeting of the Chapter, provided that the amendment has been submitted in writing to the bylaws committee who shall in turn submit the proposed amendment along with its recommendation concerning the proposal to the members at least one week prior to the meeting at which the amendments will be considered.
