AFC made goodie bags for the Girls Basketball Team, Softball Team and the Baseball Team (upcoming) for their trips to their respective state tournaments.

AFC hosted the End-of-Year Cookout for Chipola employees and returning retirees on May 1. In conjunction with the cookout a Food Drive was held for the Chipola Family Ministries.

New officers take office in July. All members of the current Board have elected to stay on another term.

This has definitely been a year to remember, and one we're looking forward to moving past. You've probably heard updates about the college and community over the last 6 months since the storm, but here are a few that you might not know:

- All 28 buildings on the main campus received damage, and the cost has reached \$50 million, and that's not including contents.
- *More than 160,000 ceiling tiles have been replaced, and more than 17,000 sheets of* drywall have been installed.
- Its projected that the majority of repairs will be complete by the end of summer.
- Our temporary pantry is still receiving donations of food, cleaning supplies, personal hygiene products, pet food & supplies, diapers and infant-related supplies, and more. "Michael's Pantry" will turn into a permanent food pantry over the summer to continue helping students with food insecurity. Thank you to all the colleges, chapters and AFC Tallahassee for the truckloads of donations!
- Gulf Coast AFC members received extra emergency funding, thanks to the generosity of Northwest Florida State College, and their donation of \$1,500. Funds were also taken from our chapter's fundraising account and a total of 7 AFC members received \$300 each in March --- this was above and beyond the AFC Tallahassee emergency funds.

In other AFC-related updates ---- the slate of new officers is in process with most positions filled already; elections will take place next week.

In December, our members, along with the Professional Employee Council, stuffed and delivered 500 stockings to Bozeman Elementary School, which is one of several Title I schools in our service district. Children in kindergarten through 2^{nd} grade all received stockings filled with goodies and toys during their "Breakfast with Santa" event.
