History of the Association

The Association was originated in 1949 as the Florida Association of Public Junior Colleges by the presidents of Florida's first four public junior colleges. Its mission was to unite the colleges for the purposes of helping the Florida Legislature understand the junior college mission and to advocate for Florida's public junior colleges in the development of the state's long-range plan for higher education.

Since 1949, the Association's mission and purposes have grown in scope as has the Association itself. In 1971, the Association became the Florida Association of Community Colleges. The Association changed its name to the Association of Florida Colleges in 2010 to reflect the growth in many colleges to include baccalaureate degree programs and institutional name changes.

It has become the most inclusive higher education organization serving any college system in the nation. The AFC is the only organization which represents all employees, presidents, and trustees associated with a college system. Today, all 28 of the state's colleges support the work of the Association through institutional dues as do nearly 7,500 regular and retired members through the sharing of their talents, time and energy.

Organization

The Association is guided by Bylaws and organized through a network of College Chapters, Commissions, and Regions. The AFC is governed by an Executive Committee and a Board of Directors. A full-time staff of six administers the day-to-day operations, maintains membership records and coordinates communications and professional development opportunities.

AFC Mission Statement:

The Association of Florida Colleges, Inc. is the professional association of Florida's 28 public member institutions of the Florida College System, their boards, employees, retirees and associates, and the employees of the Division of Florida Colleges. The mission of the Association is to actively promote, represent, and support members and institutions as they provide their students and the citizens of Florida with a world-class college system.

AFC Goals:

- 1) Develop and support professional development, education, and leadership opportunities for the Association's members (Values 1, 2, 3, 5, 6).

- 8) Maintain a fiscally sound organization that is efficiently and effectively managed (Value 3).

Chapters

Our college-based Association members are organized around their respective Chapter. Each college has one chapter. While many of the Association's activities take place away from the campus, active involvement of AFC members occurs at the Chapterlevel. A chapter of the AFC comprises each member of the Association employed at the college.

The purpose of a campus chapter should be to more actively involve individual AFC members in carrying out the goals and purposes of the Association. The key word in this endeavor is communication. AFC is unique in that, by its nature, it encourages and promotes communication and interaction among all employees and trustees at a college. Because all members have equal status in the Association, and because all members are concerned about, and involved with, the well-being of their college, an ideally-functioning chapter should provide a forum for the discussion of issues which are of interest or importance to the entire community and state college family.

Regions

To provide for regional coordination, AFC has geographically subdivided the State of Florida into five regions, each coordinated by an elected region director. Member institutions in each region are encouraged to facilitate interaction among chapters and individual members through professional activities.

Region I (Florida Panhandle)

Colleges: Chipola College, Gulf Coast State College, Northwest Florida State College, Pensacola State College, Tallahassee Community College

Region II (North Florida)

Colleges: Florida State College at Jacksonville, Florida Gateway College, North Florida Community College, St. Johns River State College, Santa Fe College

Region III (Central Florida)

Colleges: College of Central Florida, Daytona State College, Eastern Florida State College, Lake-Sumter State College, Seminole State College of Florida, Valencia College

Region IV (South-Central Florida)

Colleges: Florida SouthWestern State College, Hillsborough Community College, Pasco-Hernando State College, Polk State College, St. Petersburg College, South Florida State College, State College of Florida, Manatee-Sarasota

Region V (South Florida)

Colleges: Broward College, Florida Keys Community College, Indian River State College, Miami Dade College, Palm Beach State College

Commissions

Commissions provide an opportunity for college employees with similar job responsibilities to enhance their professional skills and knowledge and to network, share, and recognize exemplary practices with colleagues from around the state.

Each commission has its own elected Board of Directors and bylaws for organizational purposes, to plan commission activities, and support the overall mission and purposes of AFC. The Chair of each commission serves on the Association's Board of Directors.

Commissions usually meet at least twice a year to provide programs of interest to commission members and to recognize colleagues and programs of an exemplary nature. The commissions provide the primary vehicle for the Association to fulfill its mission of discussing and improving matters in college educational programs, curriculum development, innovative administrative and instructional procedures, and the general professional environment of the state's 28 community and state colleges.

Committees

AFC has standing and ad hoc/special committees that serve at the pleasure of the President. These committees deal with policy and governance issues as well as with issues that affect the association's daily operations. The standing committees are:

Operational Plans

The goals and the objectives of the Association are accomplished by the AFC organizational units with support from the AFC Staff. These units are Chapters, Regions, Commissions, and Committees (standing and ad hoc / special). These units are established in the Association's Bylaws. The Association's Standing Rules describe the purpose and responsibilities of each unit, the duties of state-wide offices and operational information for the Association.

The Operational Plan for each organizational unit is outlined in the pages that follow. Unit goals, objectives and activities for 2019 for the Organizational Units are included.

Planning and Development Committee

The Planning and Development Committee reviews, monitors, and recommends updates to the AFC's "Strategic Long-Range Plan" to AFC Board of Directors. Particular emphasis is given to the Association's structure, functions, and effectiveness to determine if the needs of the membership are met.

The Committee recommends action to the AFC Board of Directors action required to meet the Association's short- and long-range goals and objectives.

The Committee is comprised of ten (10) members - a Chair, the immediate past-chair, one member from each of the Association's five (5) regions, an at-large member, the Chair of the Council of Presidents, and a representative of the Division of Florida Colleges. The Chair and the at-large member are selected by the Association President. The representatives from the regions are appointed by the President. The Division of Florida Colleges representative is selected by the Chancellor.

Members serve a one-year term beginning January 1.

AFC @ EFSC Strategic Plan/ Operational Plans - 2019

The purpose of this plan is to organize our thoughts and put into writing some of the ideas and initiatives that we as a chapter would like to explore for 2019. **Many of these ideas carry forward from previous years and are areas that we should be constantly focused.** This is not binding or all inclusive, merely an outline of ideas and potential actions and efforts. Membership – in an effort to increase membership, the chapter will attempt the following:

- 1. Reach out to adjunct faculty and full time faculty through the use of fliers and increased awareness.
- 2. Research ideas to get retirees more involved.
- 3. Have key AFC members available at social, professional development, and fund raising activities to provide information and answer questions about AFC.
- 4. Assign a membership committee to generate ideas and ways to promote AFC and increase membership.

Professional Development – AFC @ EFSC wants to help develop our faculty and staff:

- 1. Continue to provide AFC updates from conferences.
- 2. Expand marketing and information about AFC opportunities, i.e. CCP program, Region III conference, Student Development Conference.
- 3. Continue to provide Professional Development Series events.
- 4. Be active in Region III events and opportunities.
- 5. Attempt to gain more interest in the CCP program for AFC @ EFSC members.

State, Region, and Commission Participation

- 1. Encourage members to look for opportunities for leadership positions at the Region and State levels.
- 2. Send new chapter leaders to Legislative and Leadership conference.
- 3. Continue to encourage attendance at the region and annual conferences.

By-Laws Review, Update, and Publish

- 1. Keep By-Laws up-to-date.
- 2. Annual review Updated in 2018.
- 3. Complete an annual review of the By-Laws.

Chapter Book Committee

- 1. Ensure we have a designated committee for Chapter Book Development.
- 2. Understand Chapter Book deadlines and items for inclusion.
- 3. Chapter Book submitted on time in 2017 and 2018 Platinum Chapter award received.
- 4. Continue strive for Platinum Chapter.

Meetings – Begin to advertise and encourage that all are welcome at any AFC meeting regardless of membership status or officer status.

1. Board meetings at least quarterly.

2. All Member meetings at least semi-annually. This is a focus area since we have not been having full membership meetings.

Fund Raising – Continue to promote each campus to provide fundraising activities, to include, but not limited to:

- 1. Lunch time events, such as soup, salad, chili, pizza, etc.
- 2. Opportunities for special holidays, such as Valentine's Day, St. Patrick's Day, etc.
- 3. Consider fundraising for potential scholarship opportunities such as CCP or conference attendance.
- 4. Consider AFC shirt sales as potential fundraising opportunity.

Attendance at AFC Events – Focus our efforts on ensuring key and pertinent people attend the events that are related to their functions. An example of this would be the Legislative Liaison attending Legislative Days and AFC members who work in the student development areas to attend the Student Development Conference. It is not just about numbers but placing key people into those opportunities.

Communications – Increase communications up and down the chain of supervision:

- 1. Ensure key campus leadership receives copies of our minutes and by-laws.
- 2. Communicate with leadership our goals and activities to ensure their support and approval.
- 3. Invite campus leaders to be part of our functions.
- 4. Submissions to AFC Current.
- 5. Social Media These are already established, we need to keep them updated and current with fresh information.
 - a. Chapter Facebook Page
 - b. Chapter Blog
 - c. Chapter Website

Social Activities – Not only focus on the social aspect of fundraising events and attendance at AFC conferences, but have social activities not associated with fundraising.

Exemplary Practices – As a chapter, we need to improve on researching and discovering best practices that are occurring at our college and encourage those best practices to be submitted appropriately. For example:

- 1. Technology Commission exemplary practices.
- 2. Teacher of the Year for the Faculty Commission.
- 3. Additional commission awards and best practices.
- Showing off what we do at Annual AFC Conference 2 presentations at 2018 Conference.

Awards – We need to ensure we are recognizing the appropriate people for jobs well done. This includes, but is not limited to:

- 1. Local campus awards for service.
- 2. Distinguished Service awards at AFC level.
- 3. Unsung hero awards George Strohm for 2018.

Legislative Issues – As a chapter, we have a responsibility to communicate the pertinent legislative issues to our chapter membership. Some initiatives might include:

- 1. Legislative Liaison attending Legislative Days.
- 2. Opening a line of communication with local legislators.
- 3. Scheduling a legislative update sponsored by the AFC @ EFSC chapter. This was done in 2018.

Community Service Events – As a chapter, we should be involved in those service activities related to AFC events where we collect items to take to conferences to support the community. We should also consider involvement in local community service events:

- 2. Cancer Awareness Events
- 3. Holiday Gift Drives
