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



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Hotel Map

ACADEMIC AFFAIRS

Programs designed to help students achieve their educational and life goals by improving curriculum or instruction while striving for excellence in the quality of learning.



My Bridge to Success **St. Petersburg College**

Redesigning upper-level developmental math, reading, and writing courses as eight-week, 2 credit hour courses reduced the time that some students spent in remedial coursework; allowed some students to take transfer level math, reading, and/or writing courses in the same semester; individualized instruction through course modularization; and promoted student success through careful supervision/mentoring by faculty. Content delivery included mini-lectures by faculty and diagnostic testing to tailor instruction for specific course competencies.

Chancellor's Best Practice Awards

BUSINESS AFFAIRS

Programs developed to build partnerships with local or state businesses or programs designed to create efficiencies within an institution or the surrounding community.

Broward College President's Leadership Academy Broward College

Knowing the number of baby boomer's projected to retire from the college, as well as knowing the exact number of Broward employees in the FRS DROP program with known retirement dates; President Armstrong believed succession planning was an absolute necessity and that a leadership academy would be the most proactive way to address this need. A Steering Council worked for one year to develop the PLA program, including an application process, criteria for acceptance and components of the program, workshop topics with expected learning outcomes, and a mentoring element and with potential mentors.



STUDENT AFFAIRS

Programs intended to enrich learning through meaningful activities outside of the classroom to promote personal growth, student engagement and success.

MDC Single Stop Miami Dade College

Single Stop USA (SSUSA) in collaboration with Miami Dade College is a revolutionary initiative to slash poverty nationally with an approach that is simple, effective and ultimately paradigm-shifting. Single Stop bridges the information gap separating low-income families from life-changing public benefits, tax credits and other essential services that remain untapped and inaccessible. These basic resources - food, health insurance, child care and tax refunds - increase the likelihood that families are healthy and stable, with parents who work and children who attend school.



WORKFORCE AFFAIRS

Career, technical degree, and certificate programs which prepare students for entry into specific fields of employment.

Power Plant Technology Institute Indian River State College

The Power Plant Technology Institute at IRSC serves as a skilled worker pipeline for energy companies. Over 100 graduates have been employed in the energy sector at salaries averaging \$55,000. Students complete courses taught by industry experts, participate in paid summer internships and earn an Associate degree. The program reduces recruitment costs, creates a pool of prepared workers and supports excellent employment opportunities. The success of the program earned IRSC an NSF grant to establish a regional center for the Southeast US to train trainers in nuclear energy education.



ARE YOU A VOTING DELEGATE?

AFC is your Association. Each year, conference delegates have the opportunity to elect state officers. It is important that each chapter's delegates are actively involved in guiding the direction of the Association.

So, how do you know if you are a delegate?

Each chapter president selects delegates to represent the chapter during the Assembly of Delegates for bylaws changes and voting of new officers. Your chapter president will let you know if you have been selected as a delegate. Once your chapter has selected its delegates, an official list will be sent to the state office and this designation will be noted on your registration. When you pick up your name badge at convention, delegate will be listed by your name. Your badge should be used as identification while voting on Friday, November 2 at 7:00 am in Inverness Foyer.

How many delegates does a chapter have?

This number is based on a 1:10 ratio, i.e. one delegate per 10 (ten) paid members.

What if I need to change a delegate once we are at convention?

Changes can be made at our Credentials desk in the registration area (PreConvene). Have your chapter president come see Bobbi Moran or Alice Pendergrass at the Credentials desk and they will be happy to assist you in filling out the appropriate paperwork to make this change. These forms can only be signed by the chapter president.

The most important part of being a delegate is to be present. You must be present on Friday, November 2 to vote. Remember voting begins at 7:00 am and runs until 8:15 am. Make sure your chapter's voice is heard. Make sure you VOTE!

ATTENTION DELEGATES:

Voting for officers will take place on Friday, November 2, 2012 from 7:00AM - 8:15AM in the Inverness Foyer.

Each delegate must bring his or her name badge to be eligible to vote.

Learning Resources Commission Exemplary Practice: Santa Fe College: Library Research Award



Diana Matthews, Reference Librarian/Associate Professor, Santa Fe College

The Library Research Award is a joint collaboration between the Lawrence W. Tyree Library and the Research in Undergraduate Education (RUE) Workgroup at Santa Fe College. Its aim is to recognize exemplary research and information literacy skills of Santa Fe College students, as evidenced by course papers. The Library Research Award is an annual award and is now in its third year. Students submit research papers that were written for Santa Fe College courses within the past calendar year, along with a reflective questionnaire that gathers information about their research strategies and experience. Each applicant's packet is reviewed by both librarians and faculty from within their content area, employing a standardized rubric. Packets are evaluated both on content and on information literacy skills. Up to three awards are given annually at the college's annual student awards ceremony, each with a cash prize. The number of applicants has more than doubled from the first year to the second year, and we are anticipating that this will continue to grow. The quality of applications has likewise improved. Feedback from faculty and students has been overwhelmingly positive. The introduction of this award has helped improve information literacy awareness and has fostered connections between the library and the campus as a whole.



The College now offers five Baccalaureate Degrees and has become a State College with an enrollment of over 32,000 students.
