3.1 FAMU 2+2 Program – Dr. William Hudson, FAMU, Vice President, Division of Student Affairs

Dr. William Hudson did a presentation on the FAMU 2+2 pilot program. Dr. Ed Meadows asked how many students the pilot program will be able to enroll. 3.2 2-1-1 Services – Billie Morgan, Behavioral Health & Special Needs Program Manager, Broward 211, Randy Nicklaus, President of 211 Big Bend, Leon County/Tallahassee and Bob Arnold, Director of the United Way 211, Jacksonville, FL

Mr. Bob Arnold referred to the handout entitled Florida Alliance of Information and Referral Services. He reported 2-1-1 covers 100% of Florida.

Ms. Billie Morgan reported 2-1-1 operates a call center at Broward College and stated 2-1-1 is interested in partnering with other colleges. President David Armstrong stated 2-1-1 handles all of the first calls that come into the college. The service has been both economical and beneficial to the college. Dr. Tim Beard asked if there is a fee for their service and Ms. Morgan said there is.

4.0 Report of the Chancellor, The Division of Florida Colleges

Chancellor Pumariega introduced new staff members Ms. Stephanie Leland and Ms. Angela Long.

The Chancellor reported data for the FTE 2A Enrollment Estimating Conference is due January 30.

Chancellor Pumariega presented two handouts entitled Developmental Education and Gateway Course Success Overview and Affordability in the Florida College System 2016.

The State Board of Education will meet on January 17.

The Chancellor reported the roundtable discussion between the Governor and the college trustees went well. The trustees expressed interested in meeting with the presidents to learn more about the legislative process and topics impacting the system.

The Governor's Jobs Summit will be held in Orlando on February 2-3. Invitations will be sent out soon.

The Chancellor referred to the handout entitled Agenda Select Committee on 2+2 Articulation Workshop. She reported The Committee will hold the workshop on January 25 at Florida Polytechnic University.

Chancellor Rod Duckworth reported the Career and Adult Education Pathways Symposium was held in Tallahassee on January 10-11, 2017.

Dr. Ed Meadows asked the Chancellor to update the presidents on the WIOA information collection changes. Chancellor Duckworth referred to the handout entitled Adult General Education Data Collection and Reporting Changes. He reported there are new data elements that will be collected and workshops are scheduled to look at best practices of data collection, reporting and local level review.

In order for the Florida House of Representatives to fulfill its obligations as fiscal stewards of public funds, I am requesting detailed information about the revenues and expenditures of the colleges of Florida. Your foundation, as a direct support organization (DSO) of Pensacola State College, provides a portion of the operating budget for the college and possesses information which is integral to an understanding of the college total operating budget. So that we may better understand this fiscal relationship, please provide the following information regarding your organization in an electronic format that allows for the sorting and filtering of the data:

Revenues for FY 2015-16 - Please provide the amount of funds:

- contributed by Alumni
- contributed by the community
- transferred/provided by the College to the foundation
- generated from interest or dividends
- contributed from rental income
- contributed through foundation programs

Additionally, please provide the amount and source of all other revenues.

Details of Expenditure for FY 2015-16 - Please provide the amount expended on:

- student financial aid provided
- faculty salaries
- building maintenance and support

- construction of building or facilities
- athletics programs
- academic advisement/student support
- student housing

In addition, please provide a detailed list of all:

- travel expenditures including the names of travelers, location and event attended and total travel reimbursement for each trip
- lobbyists representing the organization and the amount of each lobbyist's compensation
- all foundation staff including their name, position, title and compensation

Please provide the amount and general nature of all other expenditures.

We appreciate your attention and cooperation with this request. Your input will be integral to determining whether our Colleges are utilizing taxpayer dollars to their highest and best use and where improvements can be made. Such public assurances represent necessary oversight intrinsic to good government and fiscal discipline. We know you agree that the taxpayer deserves the best value for their dollar.

Lastly, we recognize that your DSO has specific reporting requirements and that certain records of the DSO are confidential and exempt pursuant to Section 1004.28 or 1004.70 F.S. Pursuant to s. 11.143(2), the Legislature is entitled to obtain these records. Please provide the requested information by Noon, Monday, January 23, 2017; contact Tony Lloyd, Budget Chief of the House Higher Education Appropriations Subcommittee with any questions regarding the scope of this request.
