Chancellor Pumariega reported the Chancellor's Summit-Innovation and Excellence will be held on April 6. More information will be available soon.

The Board of Governor's Select Committee on 2+2 Articulation Workshop took place on January 25. The focus of the workshop was to find solutions to expanding and improving 2+2 articulation and looking at ways to increase options for Florida College System student AA transfers. A report with their recommendations will be coming out and the presidents will be asked to endorse the recommendations.

The College Affordability Report will be emailed to the colleges.

The Chancellor referred to the handout entitled <u>House Postsecondary Education</u>. This presentation will also be emailed to the presidents.

The Division has developed a dashboard of data on the student loan crisis. The Chancellor reported 24% of Florida College System students take out loans. The average student loan is \$5,000.

The 2017 All-Florida Academic Team ceremonies will be held on April 7.

The Committee will be looking at the true cost of online education and discussing reciprocity agreements.

Chancellor Pumariega reported reciprocity agreements will ensure colleges can offer online courses and avoid fees. The cost to join is SARA is based per FTE, with a maximum cost of \$6,000 plus an administrative fee.

President Gueverra thanked everyone for getting the information to the database for on-line programs. He also thanked Naomi Boyer for coordinating the project.

President Gueverra reviewed with the group the Council Of President's Meeting topics discussed in their last meeting:

- All on-line programs with CIP codes in one database- didn't get coverage with legislators.
- Over 310,000 students, or 40% of Florida College System students, enroll in at least one distance learning course over the course of an academic year (based on 2015-2016 data).
- Course success rates, defined as a student earning a C or higher, for distance learning courses have increased over the past 5 years, from 69 to73% (Fall 2011 to Fall 2016).
- Students enrolled in distance learning courses are as successful as students enrolled in traditional courses, with 73% of grades in both course types reported as a C or higher (Fall 2011 to Fall 2015).
- COP approved the Statement of Purpose.

Legislation filed to enter SARA deal with the distance education reciprocity agreement.

- Jeff Larson stated that the SUS Strategic Plan is getting funding and approvals. We should get a GAP analysis done. President Gueverra said that a GAP analysis is already being done for systems and institutions.
- Naomi Boyer suggested that we work with SUS on targeted pathways.
- Kendall St. Hilaire is working with Student Services Work Group and offered to see if they could share their Student Services Survey.
- Paul O'Brien stated that Kendall St. Hilaire is Chairing the Master Course Group for SUS.
- Jana Kooi suggested a partnership with SUS.
- Doug Guiler stated that Florida should be actively involved in SARA.
- Karinda Barrett updated the group on the Reciprocity Bill (SB-668 for 2017- Pro -Secondary Distance Education) the analysis is complete; they are looking for a companion Bill from the House.
- When the institutions were surveyed on who would be ready and willing to go into reciprocity; 16 institutions were interested, 11 were unsure and 1 did not want to participate.

D2L conversion to Canvas for those that are making the move

- Cost for record retention 2 years of access in native format is \$30,000.
- Vicki Milton from Chipola D2L did a fix for record retention; only the grades were exported and retained. Chipola paid Canvas to convert courses but the College could not get student data.
- President Gueverra suggested that they might be able to get assistance from COP.
- Lisa Ciardulli asked anyone converting to Canvas to keep the group informed.

Cost of On-Line

- President Gueverra asked the group to send him ideas and concepts for an approach to determine how much it costs to do on-line courses for the next meeting.
- Kendall St. Hilaire will check on what she has and send it to President Gueverra.

State Tournament is March 30-April 1, 2017, at Gulf Coast State College. *Note:* The Valencia College Red Team defeated the Chipola College Blue Team in the final match to win the 2017 NAQT Community College National Championship held in Minnesota February 23-24. In addition to those 1st and 2nd place finishes, State College of Florida placed 3rd in the field of 24 best community college teams in the country. Six of our Florida College System competitors placed in the top 12 of all national competitors in the tournament for total points scored. With their top three finishes, Valencia, Chipola and SCF earned invitations to compete at the Intercollegiate Championship Tournament where they will face the top 28 freshman-sophomore teams from universities around the country. *Brain Bowl State Advisor is James Givvines, Florida Gateway College.*

Forensics: State Tournament was held February 2-4, 2017, at Florida State College at Jacksonville. Our 2017 FCSAA State Forensics Champion is Tallahassee Community College. The Jennifer Pickman Award winner (Outstanding Novice) is Samira Taylor, TCC; the Shira Brownstein Award winner (Outstanding Spirit and Support of Others) is Angelina Mitchell, TCC; and the Coach of the Year is Dr. Camesha Manzueta, Seminole State College. *Forensics State Advisor is Chad Kuyper, Florida State College at Jacksonville*.

Music: Winter Music Symposium was held January 26-28, 2017, at Jacksonville University, with 315 students and 41 directors and faculty members representing 17 colleges attending.
