Men's Soccer (*Results*): Eastern Florida State College defeated Broward College in the NJCAA Region 8 tournament to advance to the NJCAA Southeast District Tournament, winning that tournament to advance to the national tournament, hosted by Daytona State College November 15-17, finishing 3rd in the nation. *Note:* We are one team short of Men's Soccer becoming an FCSAA sanctioned sport.

Both Miami Dade and Polk advanced to the NJCAA Division I National Championship, Nov 15-17, in Hutchinson, KS. Polk was eliminated in the quarterfinals while Miami Dade fell in the championship match, finishing 2nd in the nation.

Women's Division II Volleyball (*Results*): November 3-4, 2018, Pasco-Hernando State College FCSAA State/NJCAA District P Champion: Lake-Sumter State College Lake-Sumter advanced to the NJCAA Division II National Championship Nov 15-17 in Charleston, WV, falling in the first round.

Women's Volleyball Note: Five colleges joined Pasco-Hernando in Division II Volleyball beginning Fall 2018 and created the FCSAA Sun Lakes Conference. Because our Division I participation has decreased, the NJCAA has required Division I Region 8 volleyball programs to participate in a district tournament with Regions 10 and 17. After much discussion by both the volleyball coaches and the Council for Athletic Affairs, FCSAA Division I volleyball will not reconference and will remain in their current conference structure. The FCSAA State Division I Volleyball tournament will remain unchanged in regard to participants (8 FCSAA colleges), though qualifying for that tournament will change to include the following: the four conference champions, a playoff between the 2nd place conference teams for the 5th and 6th spots, and two at-large bids for the 7th and 8th spots. Following the state tournament, our top three finishers will proceed to a district tournament with NJCAA Regions 10 and 17 the following weekend. Official Statement of Position 2018-2019 LEGISLATIVE PLATFORM

The Florida College System Student Government Association (FCSSGA) represents approximately 800,000 students at 28 colleges comprised of 70 campuses statewide. The following legislative platform planks were selected by the FCSSGA Executive Board and unanimously approved at the FCSSGA State Presidents' Assembly on September 14, 2018. The positions under the planks were decided by a majority vote of voting delegates at the FCSSGA November Leadership Conference on November 17, 2018.

1. College Affordability

- FCSSGA will support any bills and/or laws that will decrease the cost of college tuition.
- FCSSGA will support any bills and/or laws that will decrease the cost of college textbooks.
- FCSSGA will support any bills and/or laws that will increase financial aid for students.

2. Safety and Security

- FCSSGA will not support any bills and/or laws that allow college students, faculty and/or staff to carry concealed firearms on college campuses.
- FCSSGA will not support any bills and/or laws that allow college students, faculty and/or staff to openly carry firearms on college campuses.
- FCSSGA will not support any bills and/or laws that allow only college faculty and/or staff to openly carry firearms on college campuses.
- FCSSGA will support any bills and/or laws that allow college students, faculty and/or staff to carry non-lethal weapons on college campuses.

3. Increase Florida College System Learning Opportunities

- FCSSGA will support any bills and/or laws that allow Florida College System institutions to offer more bachelor's degrees.
- FCSSGA will support any bills and/or laws that allow Florida College System institutions to offer more certificate and technical programs.
- FCSSGA will support any bills and/or laws that allow Florida College System institutions to offer more on/off campus job opportunities.

4. Increase Funding for Florida College System

- FCSSGA will support any bills and/or laws that increase Florida College System funding by the Florida Legislature.
- FCSSGA will support any bills and/or laws that increase taxes to increase funding for Florida College System institutions.

5. International Student Access

 FCSSGA will support any bills and/or laws that allow non-U.S. Citizens to receive in-state tuition at Florida College System institutions.
