Latin American Studies

Latin American and Caribbean Studies is an inter-disciplinary or multi-disciplinary study of the region of the world we call Latin America and the Caribbean.

Latin America is traditionally the Spanish speaking Republics (minus Puerto Rico) with Brazil and Haiti.

We add "Caribbean" to take into account the English and Dutch speaking Islands that are not part of Latin America.

using economics, history, sociology, anthropology, political science, international relations, literature, art, music and geography, race, gender, etc.



LACS students learn to view social and cultural realities from multiple perspectives, using multiple theories and methods.




H-Style learning

 - ✓ Second vertical line is a "hard skill"



Global Awareness

It is no secret that since 9/11, the War on Terror, and the economic crisis of 2008, we are experiencing a pendulum swing in attitudes from 'cosmopolitanism' to nationalism.

Learning about other cultures helps to develop a "binocular," three-dimensional view that enables one to see with greater "cultural" perception
