

The AFC is the only organization which represents all employees, presidents, and trustees associated with a college system. 



Activities and Events

AFC RESPONSE TO COVID-19

In early March, the AFC began monitoring the state's response to Covid-19. On Wednesday, March 11, the AFC Board agreed to postpone all the scheduled AFC Spring Region and Commission meetings. All were encouraged to host some form of a professional development event virtually. During this time, a plan was developed to offer, free of charge, webinars to the AFC members and others. The AFC leadership team expressed a desire to ensure that the "new normal" of self-distancing and remote work would not diminish the AFC's value to its membership or the FCS.

Although 2020 was not a normal year for the AFC, the core value of Professional Development was not lost. The AFC remained committed to supporting its member institutions by providing avenues for professional development and growth, and it provided a needed connection to those in the FCS community.

The AFC hosted and provided support for 103 meetings and conferences serving more than 4,003 members and nonmembers. The AFC traditionally hosts statewide conferences in addition to four Board of Directors meetings annually. This year, those include the Annual Leadership Conference, the Cybersecurity Conference, and the Annual Meeting & Conference. In addition to these meetings, the AFC also facilitates nine meetings annually for the FCS Council of Presidents.

CERTIFIED COLLEGE PROFESSIONAL PROGRAM

The Certified College Professional (CCP) program currently offers the Florida College Professional Certificate (FCPC) which is designed to provide a statewide overview of the Florida College System (innovative and cutting-edge professional development opportunities to AFC members.

Since its inception in 2012, the program has produced 85 graduates, and currently has 50 enrolled participants. Seven AFC members, the 9th graduating CCP class, received their Florida College Professional Certificates in the fall of 2020.

AFC FOUNDATION

The AFC Foundation, Inc. provides charitable and educational financial support to the Association of Florida Colleges, its members and institutions. The AFC Foundation operates three funds.

The Professional Development Scholarship Program annually awards members up to \$300 to participate in any AFC professional development program. Funds may be used for the Certified College Professional Program, the AFC Leadership Conference, the Campus Safety Symposium, the Annual Conference, and/or Commission and Region educational events.

The General Fund provides support for various AFC educational events as well as individual AFC members in need. The AFC Foundation provided support the AFC Trustees Commission Legislative Conference.

The Capital Fund provides resources as needed to the AFC for the maintenance of the AFC Building in Tallahassee. The Foundation purchased the home of the AFC in 2017, using resources from the sale of its previous building in downtown Tallahassee. Ten percent of all rent funds collected by the AFC are given to the Foundation.

PUBLICATIONS



Capitol Perceptions

Capitol Perceptions is published weekly during the annual Florida

Legislative Session. This publication provides updates on current legislative issues and bills as they progress throughout the annual session.



CURRENT

The Association's official newsletter, *Current*, was published quarterly in 2020.

Current is filled with informative and interesting articles about the community and state college profession as well as AFC activities, members, chapters, commissions and other groups. It is distributed electronically via the AFC website.



On the Horizon

On the Horizon, a biweekly e-newsletter sent to all AFC

members, was launched in 2018. Horizon keeps members informed of upcoming professional development opportunities, events and meetings, calls for proposals, registration deadlines, AFC membership benefits and partnerships, and other information useful to have in advance.

ADVOCACY

The 2020 Florida Legislature adjourned sine die on March 19, 2020 following a budget process that resulted in the extension of the legislative session by six days to meet the required 72-hour cooling-off period. In the end, the Legislature approved the General Appropriations Act (HB 5001), appropriating an overall budget of \$93.2 billion which takes effect July 1, 2020.

The 2020 regular legislative session included:

- 3,578 Bills and PCBs filed
- 2,596 Amendments filed
- 4,223 Votes Taken
- 40 Floor Sessions were conducted by both chambers
- 210 Bills passed both chambers

Of those that passed, 188 were substantive policy bills.

The Governor vetoed 611 items totaling \$1,000,337,940 billion.

In addition to these vetoes, the Governor authorized an annual release plan for operating expenses that will provide for a 23.5% release of authorized appropriations for each quarter of the Fiscal Year 2020-2021. This holdback of 6 percent is intended to curtail state agency spending during the upcoming fiscal year to allow for a review and potential reduction of non-essential services and programs. This 6% reduction will have unanticipated impacts on the operating budgets of each of the 28 colleges in the FSC for the current fiscal year.

The Florida College System Program Fund will receive Educational Enhancement Trust Fund (Lottery) revenue

of \$168,247,219 (+10.7%). In addition, \$1,076,168,013 (+1.5%) is appropriated from General Revenue.


Incentive funds (performance) are appropriated in two categories. \$30 million is provided for the 2+2 Student Success Incentive Fund. These funds support colleges efforts to improve the success of students enrolled in AA programs to complete critical college credits courses, earn an AA degree, and transfer to a baccalaureate program.

\$10 million is provided for the Work Florida Student Success Incentive Fund. These funds are to support college strategies and initiative to align to align career education programs with statewide and regional workforce demands and high-wage opportunities.

\$14 million is allocated for industry certifications earned by students at colleges in specific occupational areas. They are: public safety, health sciences, auto service technology, auto collision repair and refinishing, cyber security, cloud virtualization, network support services, computer programming, advanced manufacturing, electrician, welding, FAA airframe and powerplant, and unmanned aircraft systems, pharmacy technicians, and HVAC.

\$550,000 is allocated for Dual Enrollment instructional materials.

The Florida College System will get \$10,650,533 million for construction, renovation and remodeling projects at two colleges. No maintenance, rem/ren funding has been provided.
