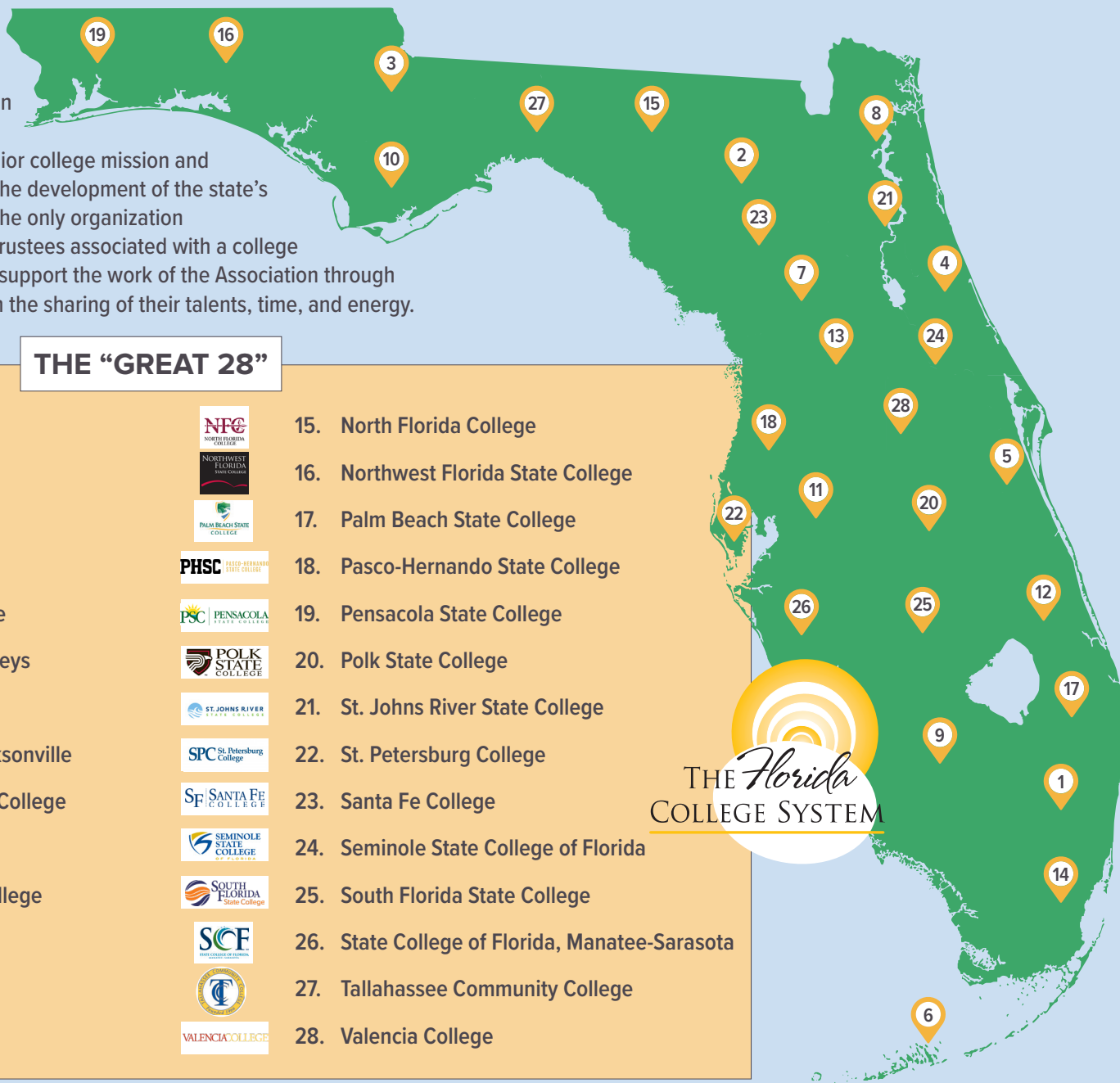

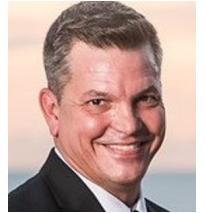


PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

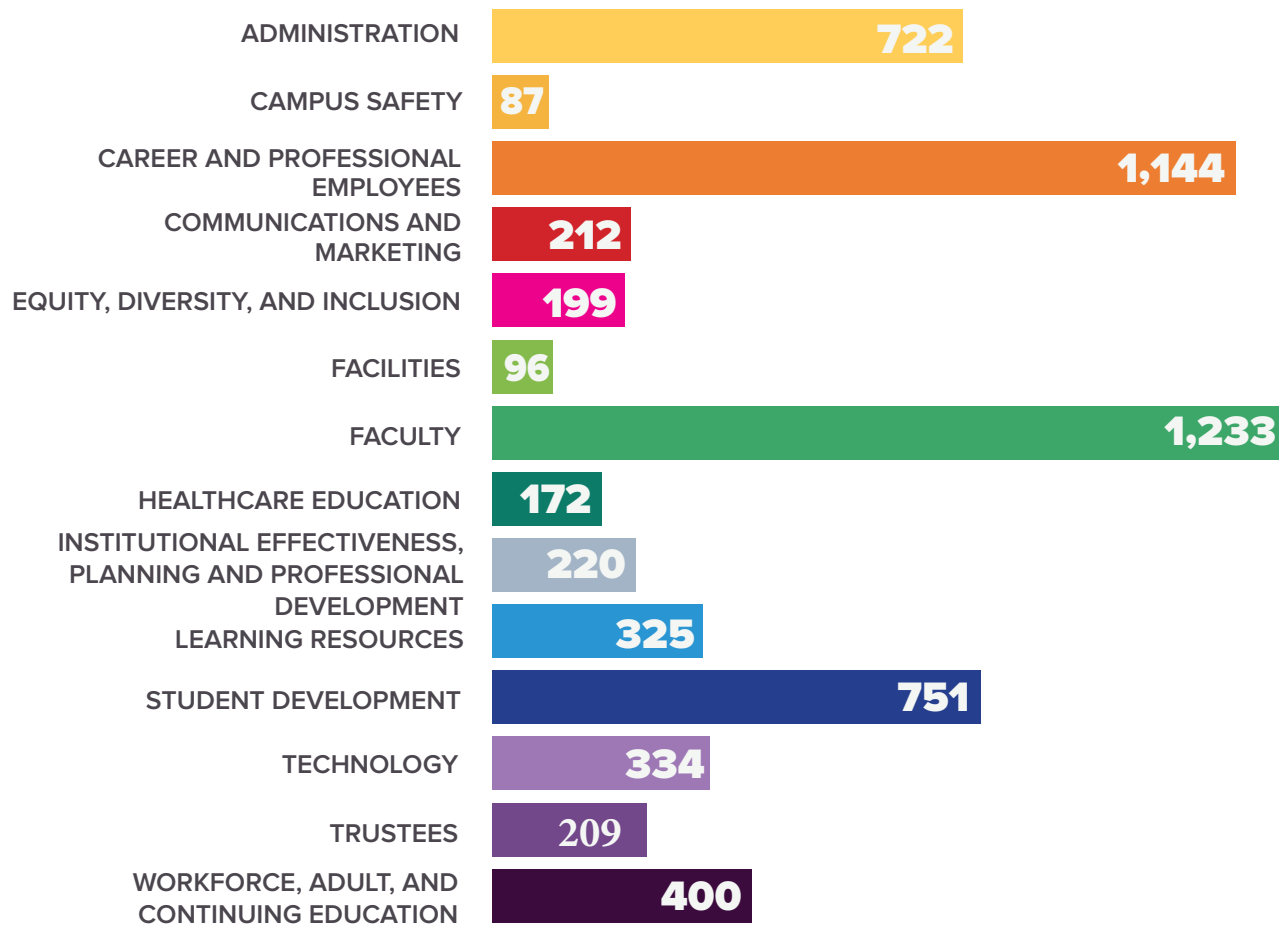

Activities and Events

The AFC navigated the challenges of Covid-19 variants, limited funding, and virtual meeting fatigue by providing a variety of opportunities for networking, professional growth and development, engagement, and collaboration. Although 2021 remained challenging, the association's core values were not lost. The AFC continued to remain true to its commitment to supporting its member institutions by offering professional development and growth avenues while providing a needed connection within in the FCS community.

The AFC supported more than 150 meetings, webinars, and conferences, serving 4817 members and nonmembers. The AFC traditionally hosts statewide conferences in addition to four Board of Directors' meetings annually. This year, those include the Annual Leadership Conference, Trustees Commission Legislative Conference, and the Annual Meeting & Conference. In addition to these meetings, the AFC also facilitated nine meetings for the FCS Council of Presidents.

CERTIFIED COLLEGE PROFESSIONAL PROGRAM

The Certified College Professional (CCP) program currently offers two certificate programs. The foundational program is the Florida College Professional Certificate (FCPC) which is designed to provide a statewide overview of the Florida College System (FCS), enhance individual job performance, build future leaders, and designate college professionals who demonstrate the knowledge essential to the practice of higher education. The FCPC offers four core courses that are available to be taken either in-person in conjunction with major AFC events or online through the CCP portal.

Since its inception in 2012, the program has produced 94 graduates, and currently has 56 enrolled participants. Nine AFC members, the 10th graduating FCPC class, received their Florida College Professional Certificates in the fall of 2021.

NEXT LEVEL LEADERSHIP PROGRAM

The Next Level Leadership Program (NLLP) is the second certificate in the Certified College Professional Program. The NLLP began in June of 2021 building upon the skills learned by graduates of the Florida College Professional Certificate (FCPC). Through the NLLP, graduates learn about themselves while learning how to be better leaders and persons of influence. The NLLP provides participants the opportunity to use, grow and refine their leadership skills as they move from theory to real-world application. Guest speakers from the FCS discuss their leadership journeys and key principles today's college leaders must employ for success. Participants complete an end of program capstone project. Session topics include emotional intelligence, DISC, difficult conversations, DEI, the mindset of a leader, and critical thinking and problem solving.

The inaugural cohort produced nineteen graduates and they received their Next Level Leadership Certificates in the fall of 2021.

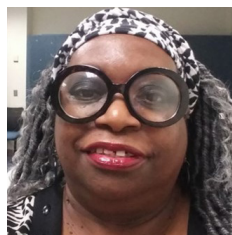

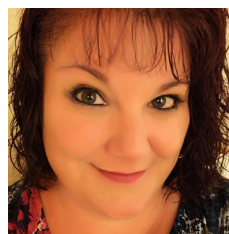

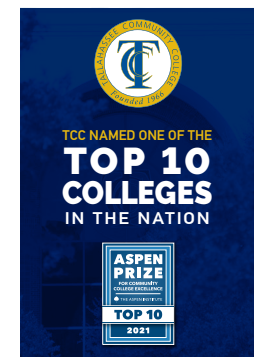

AFC FOUNDATION

The AFC Foundation, Inc. provides charitable and educational financial support to the Association of Florida Colleges, its members, and institutions. The AFC Foundation operates three funds.

The Professional Development Scholarship Program annually awards members up to \$300 to participate in any AFC professional development program. Funds may be used for the Certified College Professional Program (FCPC and the NLLP), the AFC Leadership Conference, the Campus Safety Symposium, AFC Annual Meeting and Conference, and/or Commission and Region educational events.

The General Fund provides support for various AFC educational events as well as individual AFC members in need. This fund has contributed to hurricane relief for members in need throughout the state. In June of 2021, the Foundation began its 30 for 30 Campaign in recognition of the 30th anniversary of the Foundation. The fundraiser was created to celebrate and raise money for the Foundation's General Fund.

The Capital Fund provides resources as needed to the AFC for the maintenance of the AFC Building in Tallahassee. The Foundation purchased the home of the AFC in 2017, using resources from the sale of its previous building in downtown Tallahassee. Ten percent of all rent funds collected by the AFC are given to the Foundation.

PUBLICATIONS



Capitol Perceptions

Capitol Perceptions is published weekly during the annual Florida Legislative Session. This publication provides updates on current legislative issues and bills as they progress throughout the annual session.



Current

The Association's official newsletter, *Current*, was published quarterly in 2021. *Current* is filled with informative and interesting articles about the community and state college profession, as well as AFC activities, members, chapters, commissions, and other groups. It is distributed electronically via the AFC website.



On the Horizon

On the Horizon, a biweekly e-newsletter sent to all AFC members, was launched in 2018. *Horizon* keeps members informed of upcoming professional development opportunities, events and meetings, calls for proposals, registration deadlines, AFC membership benefits and partnerships, and other useful information.

ADVOCACY

The 2021 Florida Legislature adjourned sine die on April 30, 2021. In the end, the Legislature approved the General Appropriations Act (SB 2500), appropriating an overall budget of \$101.5 billion. The GAA was signed into law with vetoes on June 3, 2021.

The 2021 regular legislative session included:

- 3,096 Bills and PCBs filed
- 275 Bills passed both chambers

Of those that passed, 188 were substantive policy bills.

The final GAA provides an overall increase for Florida colleges of \$87 million (+6.85%) over the 2020-21 operating budget.

- Program funds show an increase of \$64 million (or 5.19%) increase.
- Instructional materials of \$550,000 is removed from Florida College budget and transferred to Student Financial Aid budget (SB2500 line 73A).
- Student Success Incentives or Performance funds are \$25 million (\$15 million for 2+2 and \$10 million for workforce).
- Postsecondary Academic Library Network is \$9 million. The other amount of \$11 million is in the Universities' budget (SB2500 line 145A).
- Open Door Grant Program is \$20 million.
- Industry Certifications is \$14 million.

Of note:

- Of the \$10 million for the First Generation Matching Grant, the colleges' portion is \$2,654,332.
- Dual Enrollment Scholarship for \$15.5 million (SB2500, line 73A, page 16).

- Twenty FCO college projects for \$123 million:
 - Five projects at \$26 million (SB2500, line 20A, page 7).
 - Fifteen projects at \$97 million (SB2500, Section 152, page 452).
 - Deferred Building Maintenance of \$350 million (SB2500, page 449).
- Authorizes colleges to acquire or construct facilities which could require GR for operation and maintenance.

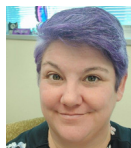
