

## NOTICE: PROPOSED AFC BYLAWS REVISIONS - ARTICLE XI: FINANCE

A proposed bylaw revision related to membership dues structure will be voted on at the Assembly of Delegates Meeting, Friday, November 8th at the AFC's 70th Annual Meeting and Conference.

The proposal does the following:

- 1. Sec. 1, 1a-e: Removes all salary differentiated dues categories.
- 2. Sec. 1, 1a: Establishes a new annual dues rate for regular members (full-time college employees) of \$50 beginning July 1, 2020.
- 3. Sec. 1, 1b: States those current regular members in good standing on July 1, 2020 may retain their current dues rate if below \$50 (hold harmless provision).
- 4. Sec. 1, 1c: States those regular members in good standing on July 1, 2020 paying above \$50 may lower their dues rate to \$50. (voluntary adjustment provision).
- 5. Sec. 1, 1d: Revises dues reimbursements to chapters effective July 1, 2020 to include 75 cents for part-time/adjunct members (they will pay half the regular rate) and that there will be no re-imbursement for retired members (they pay only \$10).
- 6. Sec. 1, 5: Clarifies who is and can be a contributing member (College Presidents opt-out aligns with established AFC-COP Memorandum of Understanding).
- 7. Sec. 1, 7: Clarifies eligibility for life membership and related dues.
- 8. Sec. 1, 8: Clarifies that the Awards Committee designates Honorary Life members.
- 9. Sec. 1, 9: Establishes Part-time employee and part-time adjunct faculty dues rates of \$25 per year effective July 1, 2020.

#### Andre Hawkins Named IRSC Dean Emeritus



fter 40 years of dedicated service to Indian River State College, André Hawkins, Dean of Indian River State College (IRSC) Northwest Center, retired on July 31, 2019. In recognition of his storied career, the IRSC District Board of Trustees named Hawkins Dean Emeritus. The honor was conferred at the June 25 meeting of the IRSC District Board of Trustees.

Hawkins began his service with the College in June 1979 starting as a Master Instructor of Educational Counseling. He was promoted to Director of Okeechobee Training School Division in 1981, and was named Director of Instructional Services in 1983. In 1986, Hawkins joined the College administrative leadership as Assistant Dean of Instruction. He later served as Associate Dean of Vocational Education (1989), Dean of Vocational Education (1997), Dean of Workforce Development (2000), and Dean of Special Programs (2003).

In 2005, Hawkins was appointed Dean of Northwest Center. Since its dedication in 2008, Dean Hawkins had led the IRSC team at the Blackburn Educational Building, which supports the revitalization of northwest Fort Pierce and serves as the hub of the R. Duke Nelson Human Development and Resources entre (HDRC).

Throughout his career, Dean Hawkins has built positive and enduring relationships within the community, opening the Blackburn Educational Building to many groups and agencies, including fraternities, sororities, the Boys and Girls Club, and the Zora Neal Hurston Committee. For 30 years, Haskins served on the Martin Luther King, Jr. Commemorative Committee of St. Lucie County.

His leadership extends statewide. Hawkins has held countless roles with the

Association of Florida Colleges (AFC). Included among these are IRSC Chapter President in 1986, President of the statewide organization in 1991, and Chairman of the AFC Foundation Board of Directors, a position that he still holds today.

Today, the Indian River State College Foundation recognized Deborah Liskin, Cosmetology Department Chair, with the Anne R. Snyder Department Chair Excellence Award. The accolade, conferred annually during the Foundation's Faculty Welcome Breakfast and Awards, is presented to a department chair who exhibits outstanding leadership, contributes toward the achievement of the College mission, demonstrates curricular innovation, and is committed to student success and completion.

Liskin began her 24-year career at IRSC as a part-time institutional assistant in 1995. She began a full-time position with Student Affairs in 1997, and in 2001 added the role of Cosmetology Adjunct Instructor. #### MAKING THE GRADE: NORTHWEST FLORIDA STATE COLLEGE EXCELS WITH NURSING PROGRAM

NICEVILLE, FL - Spring 2019 saw the largest graduating cohort ever for Northwest Florida State College's Associate of Science in Nursing (ASN) degree, with 56 students graduating. If that was not enough good news for the ASN program at NWFSC, every student who attempted the National Counsel Licensure Examination for Registered Nurses (NCLEX-RN) this spring (55 of 56), passed the test and obtained their license.

"I am so proud of these graduates and am honored to work with the ASN faculty members who always strive for excellence in the classroom, labs and clinical settings," said Dr. Charlotte Kuss, director of nursing at Northwest Florida State College.

"As this largest cohort of Northwest Florida State College RN graduates joins the hundreds of Raider nurses already in practice, we know we're changing lives and making a difference in our communities."

The NCLEX-RN is a nationwide examination for the licensing of nurses and must be passed before being licensed to practice nursing in the United States and Canada. Northwest Florida State College's NCLEX-RN passing rate is so high that it ranks in the top percentile for nursing passing rates in the country.

Currently our College's NCLEX-RN passing rate is 98.5%, while the State of Florida's passing rate is 72.9%, and nationally the passing rate is 89.3%.

"Our nursing program is a reflection of our College's goal, to be the best at what we do," said Dr. Devin Stephenson, president of Northwest Florida State College. "I am pleased to see our students and faculty members rising to the challenge and creating one of the most successful nursing programs in the country."

The ASN program began at Northwest Florida State College in 2001, with the first graduating class in 2003. To date there have been 29 ASN graduating classes over 17 years.
